Description:

Roofed columbarium of brick and wood construction set within a memorial garden.

Inscription:

'Erected to the memory of MEMBERS OF THE MERCHANT NAVY who lost their lives through enemy action in World Wars I and II, many of whom were well known in the Port of Sydney AND the burial or depositing of ashes of seamen of all nations

SS FINGAL, a Norwegian Merchant Ship (2137GRT) on charter to the Australian Government. Sailing from Sydney to Darwin shipping cargo and ammunition, escorted by the USS Patterson she was torpedoed by a Japanese submarine off Nambucca Heads on 5th May 1943.

Lieutenant Commander Desmond Woods has served for more than 40 years in the RNZN, the Royal Navy the British Army and the RAN as an education officer teaching naval and military history and strategic studies to officers.

He is a councilor of the Australian Naval Institute and the Australian Institute for International Affairs and is a regular contributor of naval articles and book reviews to Australian and international historical journals.

(In military tradition, the Last Post is the bugle call that signifies the end of the day's activities. It is also sounded at military funerals to indicate that the soldier has gone to his final rest and at commemorative services)

ONE MINUTE'S SILENCE - a sign of respect and a time for reflection, concluding with 8 bells.

(Signaling the conclusion of the one minute's silence, 8 Bells will toll which is recognised on board ships as 'the end of watch' but is also a way of saying, a Sailors or Merchant Mariners own watch is over...a nautical euphemism for "finished". The MNWMF thanks the Bankstown City Band for arranging the 8 Bells)

ROUSE

(After the one minute's silence and 8 bells, flags are raised from half mast to the masthead as the Rouse is sounded. Today it is associated with the Last Post at all military funerals, and at services of dedication and remembrance).

Message from

His Excellency General The Honourable David Hurley AC DSC (Ret'd) Governor of New South Wales

As we approach ANZAC Day, when we honour and pay homage to our fallen comrades from all wars, we remember the important role of the Merchant Navy throughout our service history. I would like to especially acknowledge our elderly mariners and our World War Two Veterans present at this 54th Merchant Navy Commemorative Service.

Thousands of Australian merchant mariners served during both World Wars on Royal Australian Navy ships, including on submarines and armed merchant cruisers, and in the merchant navies of Allied nations.

In the First World War, the merchant ships transported all of our troops to Gallipoli, and in many cases landed our troops on the beach at ANZAC Cove in the ships' lifeboats, which came under the deadly fire from Turkish guns. The great majority of wounded in that campaign were taken in the ships' lifeboats to the hospital ships which were waiting offshore. The merchant ships evacuated most of our troops from Gallipoli to Alexandria, Lemnos and Cyprus and then transported the wounded home to Australia.

It was widely recognised at the time of the Second World War that both the European and Pacific theatres could not have been won without the bravery, dedication and service provided by the Merchant Navy. Australian merchant seamen played their part with distinction in earning our final victory. Many paid the ultimate sacrifice and their resting places lie on shifting tides far and wide across the oceans.

On behalf of the people of New South Wales, I pay my respects to Merchant Navy veterans and their families, and convey my thanks to our merchant mariners, past and present, and to our heroes of the sea who have, indeed, 'crossed the bar'.
